EARLY HOMESTEAD EXPERIENCE

In 1852, Door County was a collection of simple villages scattered throughout the peninsula. Settled by farmers, lumbermen, and fishermen, the communities built churches and established schools; barns and stables were raised. General stores stocked everything from calico to cookware, boots to buckets.

Today, the Heritage Village at Big Creek welcomes visitors to its collection of nine buildings. Each structure reflects a specific period of the peninsula's development. Seven of the buildings are original to Door County. A simple white steeple church and a one-story general store are replicas of the peninsula's first Protestant church and Greene's General Store.

From mid-June through mid-October, the Heritage Village at Big Creek is open daily from 1:30 – 3:30 pm. Special programming is featured Sunday afternoons at 2 pm. Admission is free; donations are appreciated.

Guided group tours (\$5 per person) are available by reservation. The Heritage Village at Big Creek is available for special events.
